HCSC operates Blue Cross and Blue Shield plans in Oklahoma, Illinois, New Mexico and Texas.

The newly renovated facility is on the fourth floor of Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Oklahoma's existing building at 3401 NW 63rd Street. The sales contact center currently staffs 48 employees, and it is expected to grow to more than 100 employees over the next three years.

"We're pleased to have the opportunity to bring more jobs to Oklahoma," Marshall said. "And we're grateful to the community leaders at the Oklahoma City Chamber for making this possible."
